PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2010/2011

It has been another great year for the Orca Swimming Club. Club swimmer numbers continue to climb and a waiting list remains especially for learn to swim swimmers. Our coaching team has generally remained constant and been led by head coach Daniel Hayes a former Southland Rep and Orca swimmer. We offer a good standard of coaching at all levels from swimmers new to the water through to early competitive swimmers. Oscar, the Southland development coach spent some time at our club night and reported positively.

A big thank you to all of our coaches who gave up their time to coach and assist on club night. A special thanks to club night manager Philippa Marshall who does a fantastic job of running club nights, organising coaches, arranging assessments and group placements and generally keeping things ticking each Tuesday.

Orca competitive swimmers have also had a great year with a number qualifying for national meets. Unfortunately some of our swimmers have experienced illness as well and this has had a significant impact on their swimming programmes. It is great to see individuals fight back and continue to train and compete and not be 'sidelined' by their experience. Particular mention must be made of Brydon Harrington, diagnosed with Diabetes last year.

At the senior level Andrew Bester and Michael Finlay have had a good year competing at national level. Both qualified for and attended all national meets they were eligible for including NZ Age Group Champs, NZ Open Champs and NZ Short Course Age Group and Open Champs as well as travelling to Australia to compete. Both swam well making finals, producing good times including Southland records. Brydon also qualified for Age Group meets but did not attend.

The NZ Nationals Division II team included six Orca Swimmers - Sam Grant, Gabbi McLeay, Harriet Grant, Holly Pierce, Tom Wylie and Toby Flatley. Unfortunately the meet was postponed due to the Ch-Ch earthquake but Toby, Tom and Sam attended an alternate meet -the Ch-Ch Earthquake Relief Meet held in Rotorua on the same weekend. All three swam very well. Gabbi and Holly are heading to Rotorua in July for the Div II meet postponed from March.

Olivia Thornbury and Chris Grant represented Orca at the NZ Junior Nationals meet in Wellington and a large number of Orca swimmers represented Orca at the South Island Country and Town meet in Greymouth.

Well done to all of our competitive swimmers it is great to see so many of our younger swimmers performing well and coming through the ranks.

We also have a good number of swimmers coming through from club night and having a go at competitive meets such as the ribbon carnival. For the club to continue to have good numbers of competitive swimmers it is important that younger swimmers are encouraged and supported to have a go at these meets.

The 2010 Orca Labour Weekend meet was, yet again, another success. Although swimmer numbers were down slightly the total number of swims increased. Changes to the programme were well received and enables swimmers of all ages to compete in 50 metre races in all strokes. We expect, because of the earthquake and where the meet is positioned in the calendar, that entries will be significantly greater in 2011. This meet is a good opportunity for Orca to contribute to the swimming programme, promote the club and raise much needed funds for the operation of the club.

I would like to thank the team that organised and ran the 2010 meet.

I would also like to thank our Patron and life member Pat Ward and life member Allan Matheson for their ongoing support. I would also like to thank Lyn Sutherland, Nadia Rose, Tim Ward and Vicki Finlay for their ongoing support and hard work. It is fitting that Pat, Nadia, Tim and Vicki have been nominated for Swimming Southland honours awards this year.

Finally I would like to thank the hard working Orca committee. A number of committee members are stepping down this year including myself. I would particularly like to mention Lisa Crooks our Treasurer and Stu Wylie our Funding/Grants Manager. Both have worked tirelessly

over the past few years and done an amazing job to help Orca be in the position it currently is in.

Orca is very lucky to have a group of dedicated individuals on the committee who each undertake a role which collectively results in the very smooth and efficient running of the club. Special thanks to Suzie Harrington - Secretary, Jane Bester - Carnival Secretary, Philippa Marshall - Club Night Manager, Jodi McLeay - Awards/Trophies Manager, Barbara Grant - SS Liaison/PR, Sarah Richardson - Catering, Debbie Herrick who supported Philippa.

The 2010/2011 year has been a very successful year for the Murihiku swimming club with strong Membership in the learn to swim area as well as some excellent results from the competitive swimming.

Membership

This year's membership was once again strong with a total of 233 members.

This is made up of 145 Learners, 26 Club swimmers and 28 competitive swimmers, and 34 officials, admin or coaches.

Once again the Murihiku meet was a great success with around 160 swimmers competing, this only slightly down on last year's attendance.

Prize Money of \$2970.00 was given out this year to swimmers with extra prizes for age group winners.

This meet is our Major Fundraising activity for the year with entry fees, local Business sponsorship and raffles all combined to achieve another excellent result. This Fund raising allows the club to support our competitive swimmers by subsidising their travel and accommodation costs for national meets along with all their entry fees.

Coaches

Murihiku swimming club has been very fortunate over its long history to have the support of many parents who volunteer their time every Friday night to coach the children and this year is no exception.

A huge thank you to our Head Coach Phil Tomlins and all the coaches, Murihiku success as a club is directly related to the efforts of these Volunteers.

Competitive swimmers

Murihiku had 28 competitive swimmers this year with some excellent results.

We had good representation at the following national meets:

South Island Country & Town –

Div 2 – 3 Qualified

New Zealand age group short course – 1 Qualified

New Zealand age group long course – 5 Qualified

South Island Champs – 7 Qualified

New Zealand Juniors – 1 Qualified

As well 9 southland records were broken by Murihiku swimmers and Murihiku won the Martin Cup for the most points at the Southland Champs along with many other individual trophies.

Unfortunately she had to scratch from the 400IM due to illness.

Our club has 213 members, including the committee, this is down on last year but there is a long waiting list for the learner's pool which is promising.

Our competitive swimmers are doing very well and our non competitive swimmers are enjoying learn to swim, improving their skills and achieving their distances.

Liam Cullen had some great races at the New Zealand Junior Championships which were held in Wellington in February. He won gold in 50m Breaststroke and silver in the 100m and 200m Breaststroke in the 12 year age group. He broke 4 under12yr old Southland records this year. Well done Liam.

Thomas Kennelly raced the 200m butterfly at the New Zealand Age Group Championships in Wellington in March where he was placed 4th. Thomas also swam at the South Island Championships in September and won gold in 200m butterfly and silver in 100m butterfly. He has been selected in a South Island Development camp which will be held in June in Dunedin. Well done Thomas.

Hanna Beck, Samuel Cullen and Kimin Kim all qualified for the South Island Country and Town meet in Greymouth.

Ashley Kim swam in the Ribbon Day meet and won ribbons in all 50m events.

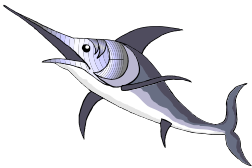

In February she swam at New South Wales Championships and won gold in the 400m IM and silver in the 200m IM. She is currently holding 50 Southland Records and 5 New Zealand records. Last week at the New Zealand Open Championships she qualified for the World Championships which will be held in Shanghai, China later this year in the 200m IM. She won silver in the 100m backstroke and gold in both the 200m butterfly and 400m IM. Well done Natalie, keep up the hard work and we wish you all the best.

Fiordland Ribbon Meet – In December we held our ribbon meet. Very pleasing entries with 51 of our own swimmers competing, some for the first time. It was the first year we awarded sash ribbons for the top three placings which proved to be popular with the swimmers.

Meets

A number of our Fiordland Swimmers have travelled around Southland throughout the summer to compete at various competitions.
